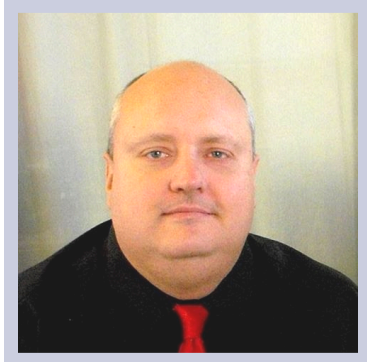

Preaching & Youth • IN • 1997 • 6.5 years

Church of 12 that grew to 75 at its peak. Returned church to New Testament Christianity with preaching, youth work, organizing, counseling.

Preaching • IN • 2004 • 5.5 years

Church of 30 that grew to 90 in awa. Worked mainly with healing splits in worship styles. Hired a new song leader, an associate, and instituted an additional elder. Left only because of burn out, as it was a very difficult situation and I was not as experienced.

Preaching & Youth • OH • 2010 • 3.5 years

A church of just 12 that grew to a respectable 40 with a new youth group. Could have done more, but Elders had a different vision, which was their prerogative. So we left to do mission work in Arizona.

Preaching • IL • 2016 • 3.5 years

A church of 25 built back up to a financially stable 70. Provided spiritual healing, installed new elders and deacons and the building was renovated.

Preaching • NM • 2020 • 2.5 Years

Began ministry right at the “two weeks to stop the spread” that lasted nearly 3 years. Huge political divide in the church as to how to handle governor’s shutdowns. We never actually got to do much of anything due to state police interference, deaths, and fear of covid.

Preaching • GA • 2023 • 2 Years

Small church of 8 when we arrived, with some success in rebuilding, up to an awa of 30. After the death of both elders, the church wanted to become a liberal denominational church, so we felt we had to leave.
